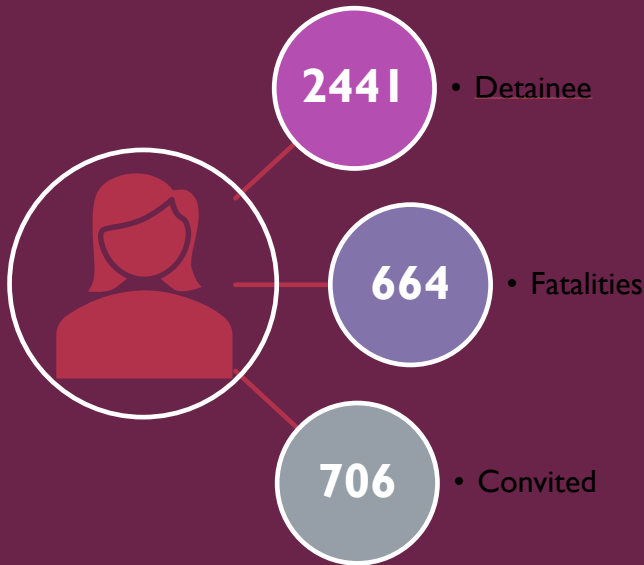


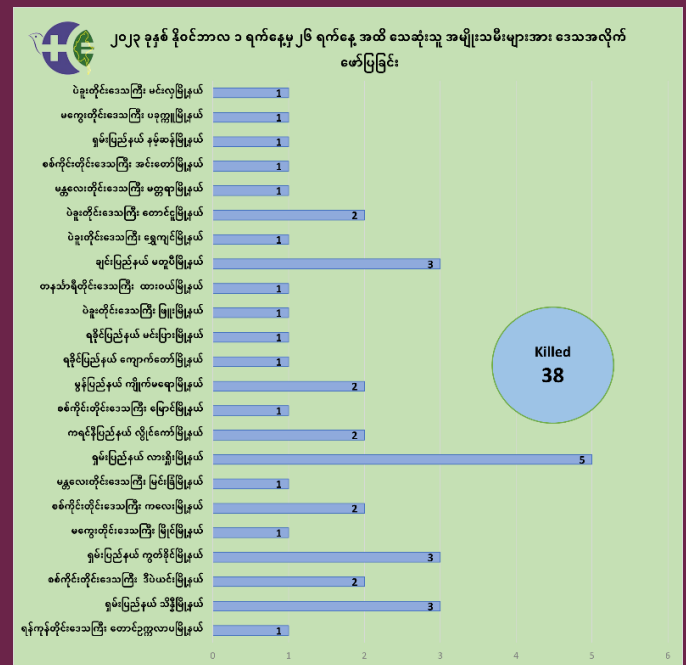
Women's Information Factsheet, November 2023



Since the day of the attempted coup by the military junta from 1st February 2021 to 26th November 2023, there were brutal tactics of military dictatorship by targeting civilians such as shooting with artillery, aerial bombardment and other aggressive attacks. As a result of such targeted attacks, the number of women killed was up to (664). Additionally, there are a total of (2,441) women who were arbitrarily arrested and detained by the military junta, among which, (706) women have been unjustly convicted.

From 1st November to 26th November 2023, (16) women were arrested by the military junta. Most of those arrested were accused of posting false information on social media, as well as composing and disseminating posts supporting National Unity Government (NUG), Committee Representing Pyidaungsu Hluttaw (CRPH), and People's Defence Force (PDFs). Those detainees were from Yangon, Mandalay, Ayeyarwaddy, Magway, Tanintharyi and Bago region, Shan and Kachin State.

In addition, during November 1st to 26th, Women fatality rate considerably increased to (38) numbers. Among those deceased women, (19) women were found dead because of artillery. (13) women were dead due to the airstrike while (4) women were shot to death by military junta forces. Not only that, a woman was burned to death alive by military junta forces while raiding the villages, and another (1) woman was detained and killed as a hostage by the junta. The women who lost their lives were mostly from Shan State, which had the highest number of female deaths in November.



This report is compiled by the Burmese Women's Union mainly based on the information provided by the Assistance Association for Political Prisoners (AAPP) and as well as information published by reliable media agencies. Due to the challenges of restriction on the information flows and communication cut of, the number on the ground could be much higher than the number which shown in this report.
