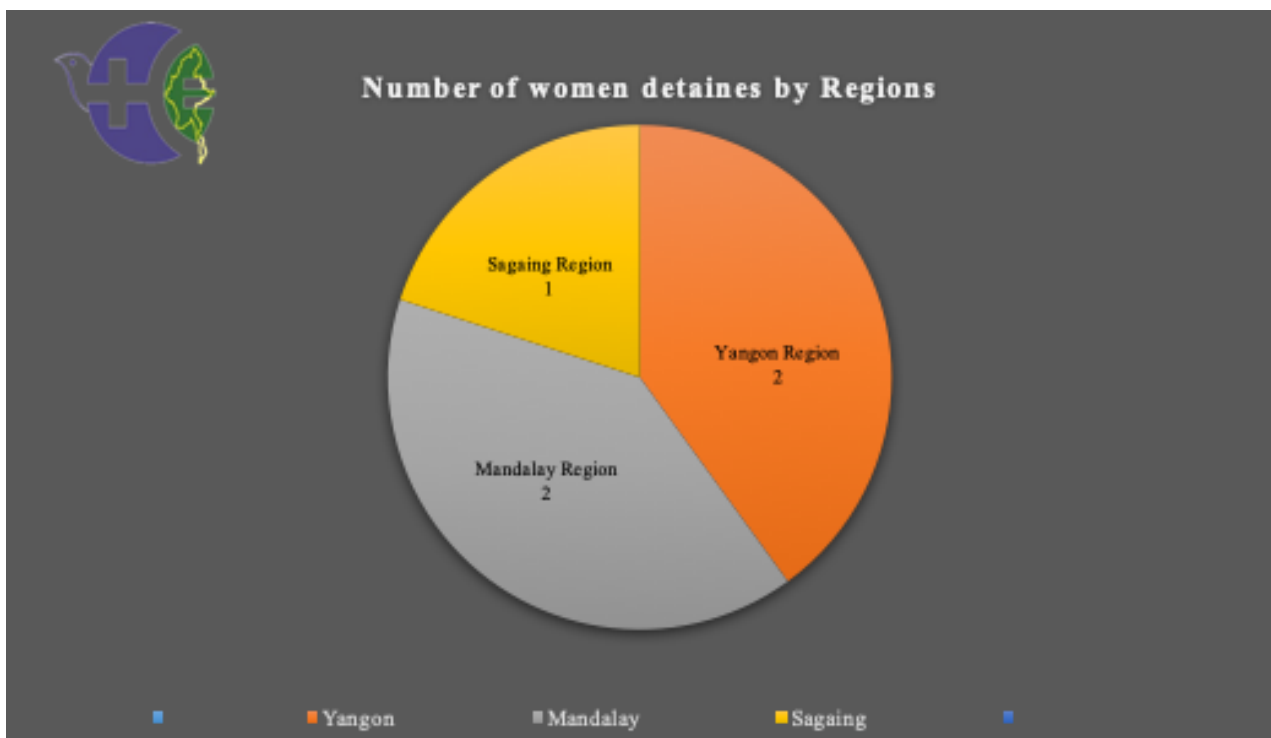
## Factsheet September 2024

It has been more than three years since the military terrorist attempted the coup on 1st February 2021; the people of Myanmar are still strongly against the dictatorial system with various forms of resistance like non-violent ways as well as armed revolution. Women are being killed every day due to grave human rights violations committed by the military terrorist. Thus, the presented data has been monitored and collected from reliable media sources and on the ground by the Burmese Women's Union (BWU). The actual figures could be higher on the ground due to the challenges and limitations of free-flow information. BWU faces numerous obstacles and challenges in accessing data and information.

Following the media data collected by BWU, the number of women fatalities was (21) from Shan State, (15) from Mandalay Region, and (8) from Sagaing Region respectively; Shan State had the highest number of women deaths in September 2024.

## Number of Women Detainees by Regions



Based on the BWU's data monitoring, (5) women were arrested across the country during this September. However, the number of women arrested could be higher on the ground. According to Assistance Association for Political Prisoners (AAPP) data, (5,690) women have been arrested and (4,072) women are still under detained since the military attempted coup on 30th September 2024.
