

2024 Women's Information Factsheet



In 2024, a total of 478 women were killed.

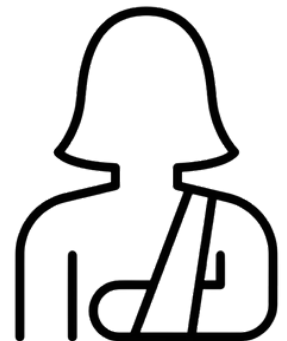
It has been nearly four years since the military terrorists attempted the coup on February 1, 2021. Throughout these years, the military terrorists have continued to commit various forms of severe human rights violations that include war crimes and crimes against humanity. Consequently, women continue to lose their lives daily due to sexual violence and other forms of human rights abuses. As of 2024, 478 women have been killed. The reported data has been monitored and collected from reliable media sources and by the Burmese Women's Union (BWU). BWU encounters numerous obstacles when accessing data and information; therefore, the actual figures may be much higher on the ground

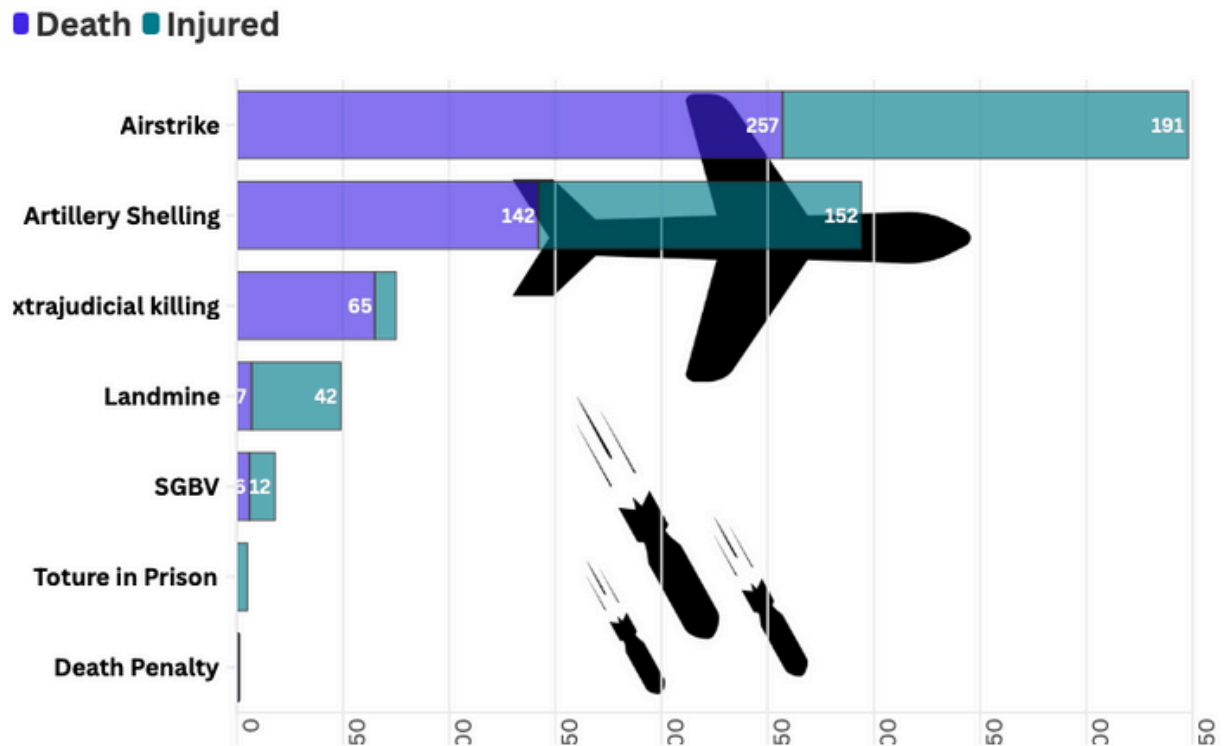

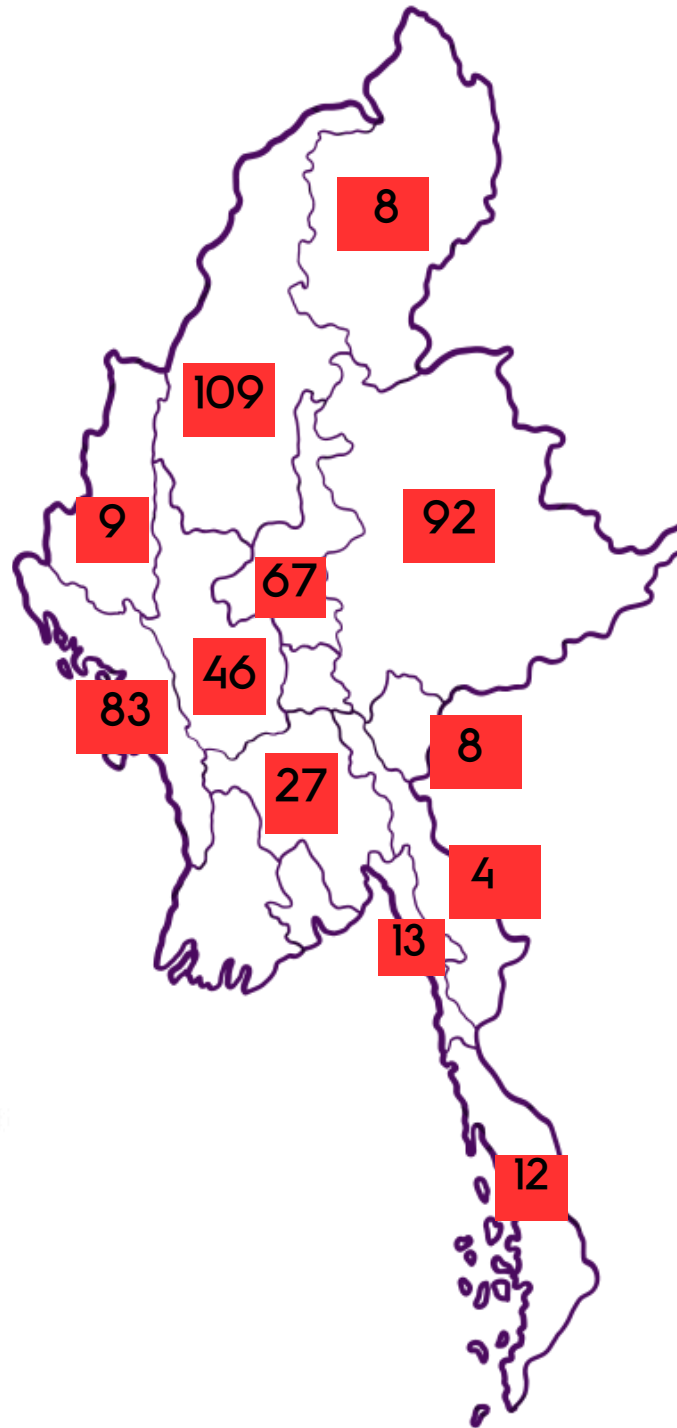
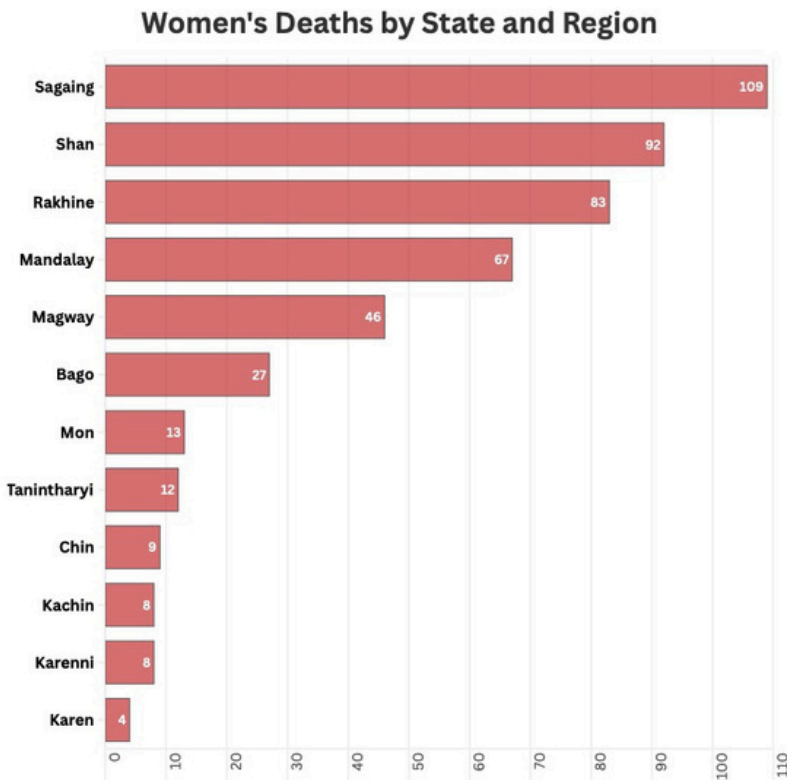

Number of Women Death and Injured



Based on BWU data monitoring from various reliable media, (478) women were killed across the country in 2024. Among them: (142) women lost their lives due to the military artillery shelling by targeting civilian homes and villages, (257) women were killed by the military airstrikes, (66) women were killed by the military without reason, (7) women died due to land mines, (1) woman was executed by the Myanmar National Democratic Alliance Army (MNDAA), and (6) women died because of conflict-related sexual violence. In addition, (412) women were wounded: among them (152) women were injured by the military artillery shelling, (191) women were wounded due to aerial bombardment by the military, (42) women were injured by land mines, (10) women were injured by extrajudicial killing, (12) women physically injuries due to conflict-related sexual violence, and (5) women were tortured in prisons.

Number of Women Deaths By State and Regions



Following the data monitoring and collected by BWU, the number of women deaths in 2024 was (109) from Sagaing Region, (92) from Shan State, (83) from Rakhine State, and (67) from the Mandalay Region. Sagaing Region recorded the highest number of women deaths in 2024.
